SUBJECT: Came of the Dai San Seitoku Maru

- Reference is made to letter CRI-P-49 dated 6 June 1955, same subject, and letter GRI-S-84 dated 8 June 1955 with petition inclosed.
- All available information concerning this incident has been forwarded to the Governor of the Ryukyu Islands with a request that the matter be taken up through appropriate diplomatic channels to fix responsibility; to secure an accounting for the missing Ryukyuan seamon; to demand adequate compensation for damages caused to the crew members of the Dai San Seitoku Maru and to the families of the missing seamen; to ensure that the perpetrators be pumished and to ensure that there will be no future occurrences of this nature.
- Your Office will be kept informed of any further developments in this case as soon as information is received.
- It is noted that the petitioners request emergency financial assistance for the families of the missing fishermen. Any such assistance is the responsibility of the Government of the Ryukyu Islands if your welfare officials determine such measures are warranted and necessary.
