From Panel Displays to Interactive Exhibits

The National Museum of Territory and Sovereignty has been temporarily closed since September 2024 for renovation work (a temporary exhibition is open in the same building). It is scheduled to reopen in April 2025, after the introduction of a number of new interactive exhibits using the latest technologies. In addition, between the summer and fall of the same year, the museum will be expanded to include other spaces in the same building. With the security situation surrounding Japan's territory and sovereignty becoming increasingly severe, we hope that many people will visit our museum.
