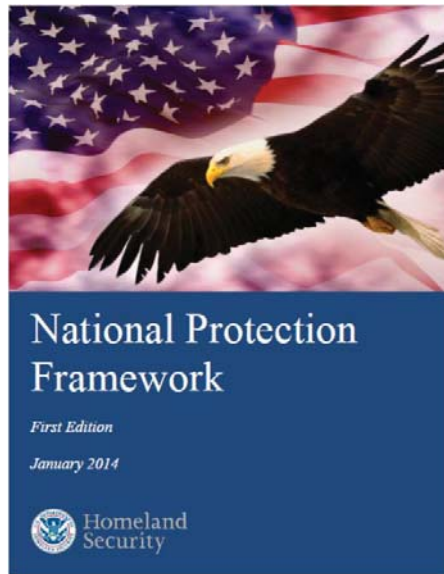
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National Protection Framework and National Infrastructure Protection Plan Overview



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National Preparedness Overview

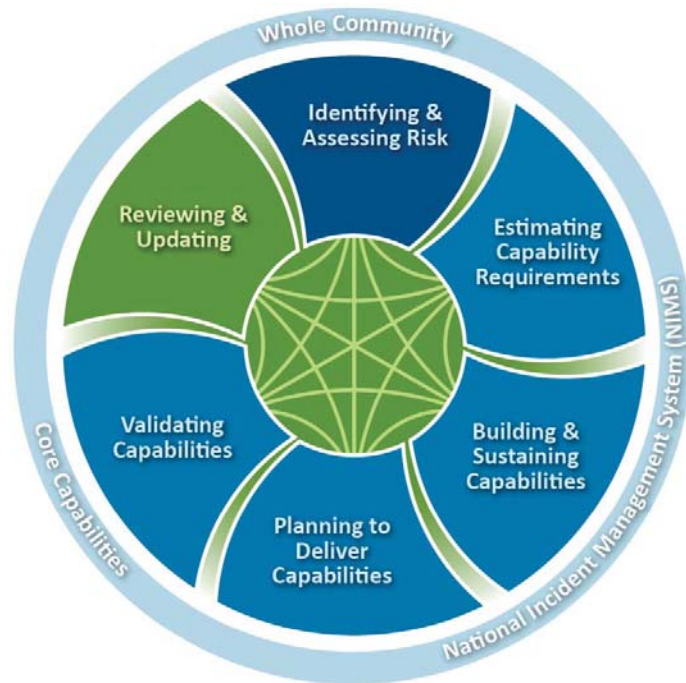


National Preparedness Goal: A secure and resilient nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk.



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The National Preparedness System



1. Identifying and Assessing Risk
2. Estimating Capability Requirements
3. Building and Sustaining Capabilities
4. Planning to Deliver Capabilities
5. Validating Capabilities
6. Reviewing and Updating



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Fourth Component: Planning to Deliver Core Capabilities



- National Planning System focuses on...
 - People
 - Processes and products
 - Enablers
 - Coordination and management



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National Planning Frameworks

- Identify scope
- Summarize roles and responsibilities
- Cover core capabilities
- Define coordinating structures
- Describe relationships to other mission areas

Federal Interagency Operational Plans

- More detailed concept of operations
- Integrate national-level Federal capabilities
- Describe critical tasks and responsibilities
- Provide for rapid integration of resources and personnel
- Consistent with national planning doctrine

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Relationship to Other Mission Areas

The Protection mission area focuses on actions to deter threats, reduce vulnerabilities, and minimize the consequences associated with an incident.



Critical infrastructure risk management activities cut across all five of the mission areas outlined in PPD 8.

- Activities focused on strengthening security can contribute to prevention and protection mission areas
- Activities focused on strengthening resilience can contribute to response and recovery mission areas
- Mitigation cuts across both security and resilience



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Linking National Protection Policy

NIPP 2013 Vision

*A Nation in which physical and cyber critical infrastructure remain **secure** and **resilient**, with vulnerabilities reduced, consequences minimized, threats identified and disrupted, and response and recovery hastened*

Security: *Reducing the risk to critical infrastructure by physical means or defensive cyber measures to intrusions, attacks, or the effects of natural or manmade disasters*

Resilience: *The ability to prepare for and adapt to changing conditions, and withstand and recover rapidly from disruptions*



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Critical Infrastructure Today

Critical Infrastructure defined: “Assets, systems, and networks, whether physical or virtual, so vital to the United States that their incapacitation or destruction would have a debilitating effect on national security, economic security, national public health or safety, or any combination thereof.”

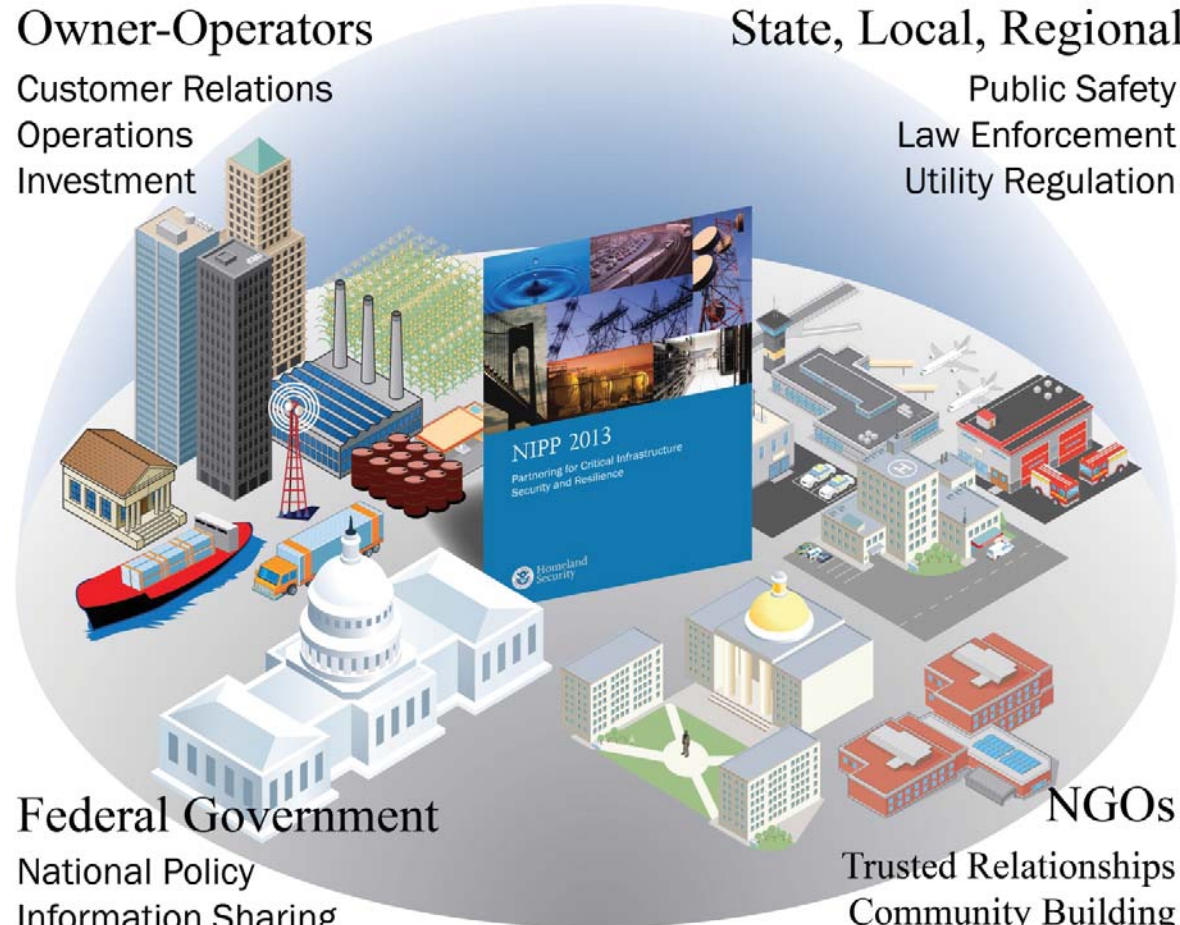

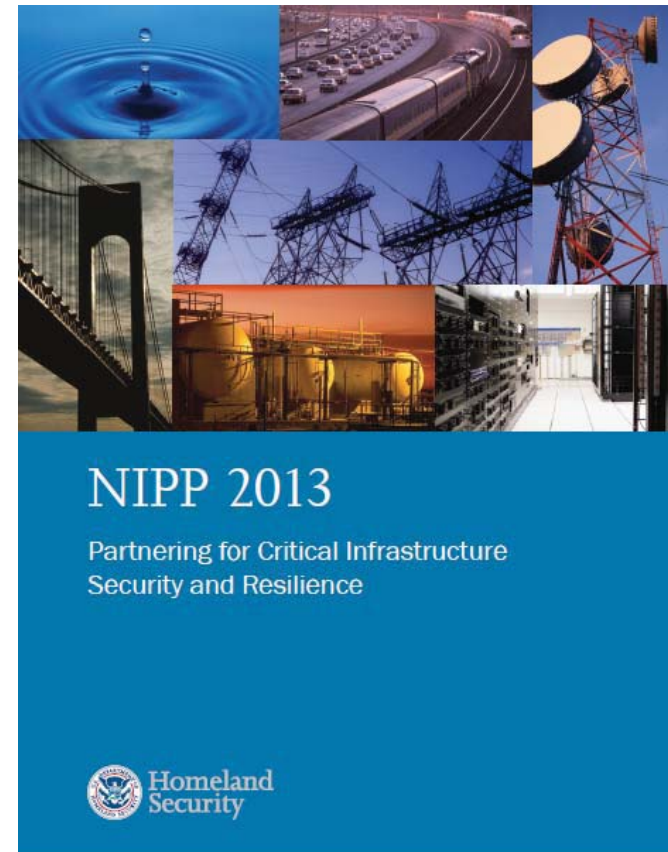
