Basic Principles for the Revision

- Push forward the changes brought about by the "three arrows" in past 12 months and keep the positive cycle of the economy running.
- Therefore, enhance the "earning power" or the profitability of the country. At the same time, address the areas such as labor market, health and agriculture, which had not been addressed enough in Japan Revitalization Strategy.
- With the economy almost exiting from the deflation, now is the last chance. Encourage company managers and individuals to take concrete actions
