

Joint Statement on the Framework Agreement between the United States and Japan on July 22, 2025

In connection with the Framework Agreement between the United States and Japan on July 22, 2025, and in response to the United States' commitments including the Executive Order on tariffs signed on September 4, 2025, Japan reconfirms the following commitments in addition to its Strategic Investments pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding:

- Incremental purchases of U.S. agricultural products for domestic consumption, including bioethanol (including for sustainable aviation fuel), soybeans, corn, and fertilizers, as well as other U.S. products, totaling \$8 billion per year.
- Expand purchase of a range of U.S. industrial and consumer goods.
- Purchase 100 Boeing aircraft.
- Expedited implementation of a 75% increase of U.S. rice procurements within the Minimum Access rice scheme.
- Stable and long-term incremental purchases of U.S. energy, including liquefied natural gas (LNG), totaling \$7 billion per year, while exploring a new Alaskan offtake agreement for such LNG.
- Increase of annual procurement by billions of dollars of U.S.-manufactured defense equipment pursuant to the Defense Buildup Program and semiconductors.
- Accepting for sale in Japan U.S. manufactured and U.S.-safety-certified passenger vehicles without additional testing.
- Providing Clean Energy Vehicle Introduction Promotion Subsidies for American cars.

For any tariff imposed on pharmaceuticals and semiconductors, including semiconductor manufacturing equipment, under Section 232 of the Trade Expansion Act of 1962, the United States intends to apply to goods of Japan a Section 232 tariff rate no greater than that applied to goods of any other country.

The United States also intends not to impose any tariff on aircraft and aircraft parts of Japan.
