Opening Remarks by Minister NISHIMURA Yasutoshi The Fourth Meeting of the CPTPP Commission June 2, 2021

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to you for joining the fourth meeting of the CPTPP Commission. I am most delighted to be able to see your healthy faces on the screen despite the current difficult situations.

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused the downturn of the global economy and increased inward-looking tendencies. As a Cabinet Minister in the Government of Japan taking charge of the COVID-19 response, economic policy, and the CPTPP, I am firmly convinced that the CPTPP will play a crucial role in transforming the post-pandemic economy to a more resilient, sustainable and inclusive one, offering the high-standard and well-balanced rules for the 21st century.
